- [CollegeNET](#) provides separate searchable databases for four-year colleges, community, technical and junior colleges including links to the actual college Web sites. The database can be surveyed by geography, tuition, enrollment, and college major.
- [Princeton Review Online](#) contains information on exploring and selecting colleges, based upon major, location, enrollment, etc.
- [CollegeExpress.com](#) is an on-line college and financial aid search program
- [University Links](#) allows the user to research college Web sites based on location (by state), descriptive category (two-year, four-year, culinary, technical, IVY League) and alphabetically.

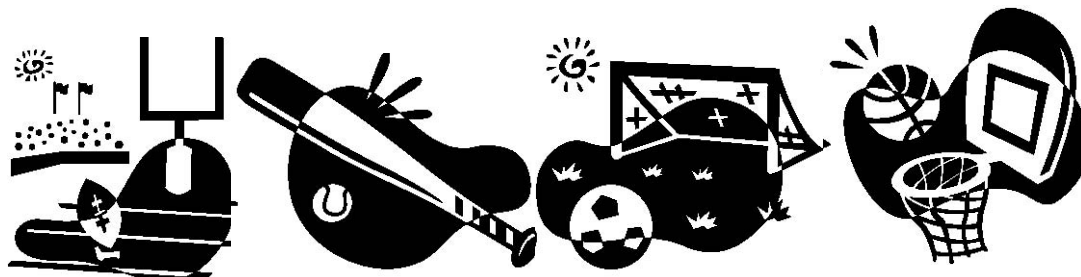
